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Rules

Entries

- All entries must have been made by the entrant stated on the entry form
- Entrants may make only one entry per class
- no item may be more than 2 years old except those that need aging e.g. wine
- no item previously entered in a Broad Hinton Spring Show may be re - entered

On the day

9.30am Hall opens for Exhibits to be set up
11.30am Doors closed and hall emptied for judging
12.00pm Judging
2.30pm Doors open to the public
4.15pm Awards will be presented
4.30pm Exhibits may be collected
5.00pm Hall closes

- All exhibitors must supply their own plates, trays, dishes, bowls, baskets, vases etc
- For each class entered a ticket will be issued which must be displayed with the exhibit
- No exhibitor shall interfere with or move an exhibit not their own. Should it be necessary to move an exhibit, it is to be undertaken by a member of the organising team
- All persons, except members of the organising team and judges, must leave the room during judging
- No responsibility will be taken for items not collected by 5.00pm unless a special arrangement has been made with one of the organising team
- Whilst every reasonable care will be taken the organising team will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits
- Do not exceed dimensions where given for a class - an entry will not be judged if it does
- Do not put a name or any feature on an entry that may identify the entrant

Judging

- The judges may withhold awards when exhibits are considered by them to be unworthy of a place
- The judges' decision shall be final

Prizes

- A prize card will be awarded to the winner, second and third placed entrant of each class
- The competitor with the most points in any one Category will be given a special award
- Points for each class will be calculated as: 1st place- 5 points, 2nd place-3 points, 3rd place-1 point
- In the event of a tie for the highest number of points in a Category the first prize for that section will be awarded to the entrant with the highest number of first prizes. If still tied, the judge will indicate the best exhibit as the deciding factor

Items Not Covered

Any questions or matters not provided for by these rules shall be decided by a majority of the organising team
