1	Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 19th March 2014 were agreed and signed by the Chair	
2	Matters Arising The previous meetings minutes were reviewed for actions, all of which were to be covered later in the meeting.	
3	Housing Needs Survey & Community Land Trust Rose Seagrief outlined the works of the Community Land Trust (CLT). There are two ways in which the Parish Council can work with the CLT, either with a Housing Association or a loan can be taken at the Parish's own risk. Long term period of payment required. Most communities would be looking at a project of between 6-10 houses at a plot price of £10,000. The PC will be assessing their views at the next meeting.	All
4	Wiltshire Core Strategy – Housing Development The Parish of Broad Hinton will need to find areas to build between 40-50 houses, between 2014-2026. Robert Horton was approached by Wiltshire Council to investigate potential building areas on his land. We have no further details of this at the moment, but Elaine Scott will send out details to the Parish Councillors in due course, which will be followed by a PC meeting.	ES
5	Septic Tanks in Winterbourne Bassett There are a number of houses that have had their septic tanks flooded due to the large volume of rainwater recently experienced and those householders have asked the PC to help them put forward plans for a grant to fund a project that will drain the excess water from behind their properties into the Winterbourne. They are hoping the grant will be able to come from Wiltshire County Council.	GH/ AS
6	Defibrillator Currently there is no Defibrillator available and a suitable site has not yet been found. Until this is resolved no further action can be taken.	
7	Emergency Planning No further action since last meeting.	
8	Traffic Plan GM reported that although he has contacted the Council with regard to the 50mph signs, he cannot be given a time when these will be erected. This is very frustrating as we have been promised these signs from the start of the year. It would appear that the 50mph speed limit is in place along with improved road signage at Elm Cross. There are Tee junction signs on the A4361 denoting Post Office Lane. It was also discussed about putting Planters in front of the signs when they arrive. GM had looked at costs, but obviously until we have the signs this cannot be progressed. Unfortunately Jim and I have not yet got together re siting of planters. We will do so soon and liaise with Highways over their location.	GM GM

WHITE HORSE GARDENING CLUB

On an unusually warm September afternoon, a careful of several Garden Club members made their way to the depths of the Pewsey Vale. Sharcott Manor was holding an open day under the aegis of the NGS. We entered the 6 acre garden through a wooded area, glimpsing "Naked Ladies" (otherwise known as Autumn Crocus (*Crocus nudiflorus*) pushing their way through the rough grass. The

wood held some unusual specimens including a Weeping Lime *Tilia 'Petiolaris'* a collection of rhododendrons and rare Magnolias . After crossing a stream we came across an orchard followed by traditional herbaceous borders flanking a large grassy area which had once been a tennis court. After a pit-stop for refreshments (almost mandatory!) tea/coffee, scones and home-made cake we headed back to the car. Perhaps they had put something in the tea because we found ourselves following a different path, one which curved down and round into a well hidden, authentic, Victorian fernery. It's very shady and rather chilly interior was lined with sandstone, built to create rocky planting pockets. The stone had been brought over from India, serving as ballast in the ship, then taken by canal to Sharcott finally arriving at the Manor by horse and cart and assembled by the estate workers. Originally, a stream-fed pool in the floor of the fernery had maintained the necessary humidity, but this was now blocked up-stream and no longer functional, an interesting glimpse into horticultural fashions of yesteryear.

Next month we start our autumn programme of talks beginning with an in-depth look at Clematis. Ever wondered what to do with that monstrous green thing that flowers in the spring, swamps your fence and then does nothing for the rest of the year? Or thought, "Why does my Clematis only flower at the top? "Quickly followed by "it says on the label it's a type 2, what is a type 2?" And anyhow how do you say it CLEEmatis or Clematis? Come and find out as Marcus Floyd, Clematis expert and grower demystifies the whole subject on Wednesday October 8th at 7.30 at the Village Hall. Plants and refreshments will be on sale and no! you do not have to be a member to attend, everyone is welcome.

VIEW FROM THE RECTORY

*It's four in the morning,
The pilgrims are snoring,
A choral song of their search;
Their muscles are aching,
Their rest they are taking,
Stretched out on the floor of our church.*

The weekend of 12th-13th September fostered in all who came a deep connection with our ancestors as Martin Palmer (www.arc.org) shared with us the remarkable story of our pilgrim past. Groups sleeping overnight in the church, rising with the lark at sunrise and breaking bread together, walking down from Winterbourne Bassett to Avebury, and from there to Bristol, taking ship for Spain, Santiago di Compostela, Rome and Jerusalem. Goosebumps and awe as we realised that for many, this would have been their final journey, and the crosses carved into the stonework of our buildings by sharp dagger-points, are in fact the 'Last Will and Testament' of those who never came back.

Someone who knows what it is like to set out in the manner of pilgrims of yore is Matthew Hopwood, good friend, Avebury resident and fellow spiritual seeker. Through end September and October he will walk from Avebury towards Lindisfarne in Northumberland, a journey of 400 miles. Travelling with a small bag, a guitar and a walking stick he hopes to be joined en route by friends and strangers. Matt will visit wells and springs, causeways, hostels, churches, ancient woodland, inns, coffee shops, prisons and more. He will pass through the urban centres of Manchester, Birmingham and Newcastle as well as the rural landscapes of the Peaks, the Dales and the Northumberland coast. On the way he will stay in abbeys, farms, local homes, churches, barns, on the path and wherever serendipity and hospitality take a foothold, eventually finishing up on the holy isle of Lindisfarne, crossing the causeway while the tide is low. In the manner of pilgrims of old Matt, his wife Petra and my husband Phil will sleep overnight in Winterbourne Bassett church, relying on the hospitality of the community for companionship, prayer in the morning, and food for the journey and by the time you read this will already be well on the road.

Our life journeys, too, are travelled best within the company of others. Even the lone wayfarer must travel in the hope of the kindness of strangers and unexpected offers of hospitality and shelter. No matter how deep our independent and 'lone wolf' natures, we do all in the end crave something of companionship and love - even the desert hermits, apparently alone, felt the spirit of God in the living creation around them as their companion. Matt's pilgrimage is not a matter of simple re-enactment but a new pilgrim journey, mirroring our own daily journeys, where the destination isn't a goal to be achieved in the secular sense but an arrival at a new place of being, understanding, and growth from the solitary silences and encounters alike, good and bad, and everything in between. Thus it is with our daily life pilgrimage. We set out, we encounter, we walk on but not alone for we are always accompanied by something bigger, something that cannot be captured or restrained or even pinned down no matter how much we try, and it is this 'something,' whatever we call it, that draws others to us for shelter, or to offer shelter, and to walk a bit of the road that is shortened when two or more walk together.
