Through all the dark days of Richards illness, Richard and I and our family have been sustained and strengthened by our church and by the warmth, kindness and friendship of those who live in Broad Hinton, Berwick Basset and Winterbourne Bassett and surrounding villages.

Richard battled courageously for seven years with cancer; he was very tenacious of life but sadly in the last couple of months we were unable to bring him back to his much loved farm, Whyr, here in Winterbourne Bassett.

He died peacefully in the Princess Grace hospital in London.

Richard did return to Whyr for his final journey to Semmington on March 22nd; on Friday 15th we held a thanksgiving service to celebrate his life here in our village church, St.Katherine and St.Peter.

He loved belonging to the community here in this beautiful part of Wiltshire in which the Church played a central role. Such a church body creates a strong force of energy, affection and determination that somehow, in all the ups and downs of our human existence "all will be well".

## Yew Tree Lane Closure Notice

This Order will come into operation on **28<sup>th</sup> April 2016** and it is anticipated that the closure will be required for up to 2 days

### Wiltshire Council

#### Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

#### Urgent Closure of C121 Yew Tree Lane (Part), Broad Hinton.

THE WILTSHIRE COUNCIL HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that on 28th April 2016, the following length of road shall be closed to all traffic in the interests of public safety. C121 Yew Tree Lane (Part), Broad Hinton. From its junction with C415 High Street to outside property "Yew Trees".

## Ridgeway Ladies

You may have seen on the A30 Salisbury to Shaftesbury road a series of badges carved into the chalk. Ever wondered what they were, why they were there, how and when were they carved? On Wednesday 6th April the Ridgeway Ladies were delighted to welcome Dr Tony Phillips to their meeting to enlighten them on these amazing carvings.

The Badges, known as the Fovant Badges, were initially dug out during the Great War by soldiers stationed at the nearby military camp. By the end of World War 1 there were twenty Badges (Military Crests) spread over Compton, Fovant and Sutton Downs. Over time nature has not been kind to the Badges and many have disappeared. However, initially due to volunteers and now in the capable hand of experienced contractors, many of the Badges have been returned to their former glory. The Fovant Badges Society, a charitable trust, is now responsible for overseeing the ongoing maintenance and preservation of the Badges. The twelve remaining Badges are now an English Heritage Site and in 2005 the Badges were formally registered by the Imperial War Museum as War Memorials.

Dr Tony Phillips, a member of the Fovant Badges Society, gave us an interesting talk on all aspects of the Badges and we now know a bit more of our local history. For more detailed information visit [www.fovantbadges.com](http://www.fovantbadges.com).



## View from the Rectory

Our society is underpinned by institutions: Government, Church, education, health, finance, the law, charities, voluntary bodies, shops, conglomerates – the list is endless. For better or worse most are shaped by rules and regulations, codes of conduct, historically inherited formulae. Institutions may be well regulated while also flawed. When these bodies work well our lives are improved, not because of the institutions but because employees or volunteers act with integrity, selflessness, and a grounded purpose to serve the community to the best of their ability.

Behind every institution is an army of people. Behind the rules and regulations lie people, and sometimes both are flawed. BUT I say it again – **behind the facade of all institutions are human beings**. They live in our villages; they are our neighbours, friends, fellow worshippers, our drinking buddies, the parents of our children's school-mates. We encounter them in the local shop or market; we turn to them in times of need or celebration. So why is it then that I see hearts broken and relationships destroyed by the thoughtless actions of those who are unable to separate people from their work places? Why is it that people who work **for** institutions are **being** thought of as being the institution? Why is it that those who are merely employed by organisations face criticism, opprobrium and censure for proposed changes/past mistakes as if THEY are the ones at fault? Why is it that people who live amongst us as neighbours feel they can no longer eat in a pub, attend a church service, stop to talk to a neighbour for fear of being 'cut dead'? Since when have we become so blinded by the institutions' actions that we fail to continue to love and respect our neighbours 'as ourselves'?

Some of you, dear readers, will wonder what on earth is going on to prompt this article - please spare a thought for those who work for a maligned institution be it NHS, the National Trust or the Postal Service. To those in the community forgetting the human face of organisations - what if it was your son or daughter who faced a backlash of disapproval simply for being an employee of a company or institution? What if it was your husband or wife who was unfairly criticised in public for non-attendance at a meeting that clashed with a family funeral? What if your father was personally blamed for road closures to end potholes and received aggressive phone calls from the neighbours? What if your mother was hounded by countless phone calls because someone disapproved of the actions of an institution? What if it was you that bore the brunt of unhelpful village gossip and opprobrium but you were unable to defend yourself due to confidentiality rules? Wouldn't you like someone, anyone, to say 'that's unfair'?

And it is. Hugely unjust; at best it is ignorance – at worst bullying. There – it is said. And it must stop.

Our local MP is NOT the government. Our local head teachers are NOT the Department of Education with an 'Academy by 2020' Agenda. Our local postie is NOT the Royal Mail. Our local doctor is NOT the NHS. Our local managers, rangers, heads of departments, volunteers and gardeners are NOT the National Trust. And for that matter your local priest, churchwardens or others who serve the community in this capacity are NOT the institution of the Church.

We are human beings working **for** institutions. We are first and foremost your neighbours. Oppose proposals by all means but NOT the person. Discuss the fears and share concerns - but don't blame or ostracise the worker.
